ANNUAL REPORT SEASON 2011

INTRODUCTION

The 2011 season of the North Fremantle Amateur Football Club was again significant in respect to its achievements both on and off the field including the first time the club fielded 8 teams.

Fielding three colts teams for the first time and having 91 colts players registered, the club had 4 teams make the finals with 3 premierships in D Grade, D Reserves and the Brett Jones Colts whilst A Reserves were runners up.

The club was well served on and off the field in 2011. Congratulations to Michael McCann for being selected in the WA 23's team and the All Australian team. Our congratulations are also extended to Cameron Hall who won the Association best and fairest in the D Grade competition and Michael Pepe who won the D Reserves competition in 2011.

Congratulations are also due to Cameron Branch, our football operations manager, voted as Clubman of the Year for 2011.

The North Fremantle Amateur Football Club remains one of the oldest clubs in Australian football. It joined the amateur league in 1939, a year after the competition started. Prior to that the same club was born in 1921 and played in the South Suburban League where it had great success and won several premierships culminating in winning the 1938 flag, the last year of the SSL. It meant at that time the club was without a competition and the newly-formed amateur league was an obvious move. The club started in B Grade but was clearly superior to all the teams and was promoted to A Grade. So it is our 73rd year in amateurs, our 91st year since the club reformed after World War I.

The origins of football in North Fremantle and at Gilbert Fraser Reserve (then known as the North Fremantle Oval) date back to 1895 when the First Rates competition existed. It was called this because of the word electorates and the boundaries followed closely the State Government electorates. Then in 1901 the North Fremantle Football Club was invited to enter the WAFL, along with Subiaco. Both clubs accepted and from 1901 to 1915 the club competed at that level. World War I saw more than 40 players, officials and supporters volunteer to go to war with disastrous results. A total of 32 were badly wounded, gassed or incapacitated. A further 11 were killed in action, nine on The Western Front and two at Gallipoli. So many people see the clubs celebrations dating from 1921 which makes this our 90th celebration year.

Coincidentally it also is the 50th anniversary of the famous 1960 undefeated Champions who won the A Grade flag that year.

To all members of the club, we thank you for your involvement, and for responding so readily to club membership fees and match fees, both of which were essential to meet the financial challenges of eight teams.

This coming season (2012) the club will face further financial challenges as the cost of playing community football continues to increase and resources are scarce at this level.

The Club also acknowledges the long time and ongoing generous support of its Patron, Mr Ross McCaffrey, its Life Members, its sponsors and supporters in 2011.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT (Glenn Stephens)

I am pleased to welcome you to the 2011 North Fremantle Amateur Football Club Annual Report, our fourth edition of this publication. Our club has always been one that appreciates the past and the value of documenting our achievements for future generations. I trust this annual publication will add to that sense of history and tradition.

2011 was the first year of our second rolling 3 year strategic plan and it was pleasing that the club was again supported by a pro active committee in ensuring we were again successful both on and off the field. The D Reserves had an impressive season under Neville Haywood and won the premiership in fine style.

Completing the hat trick of premierships rookie coach James Matkovich led his Brett Jones Colts to a 4 point victory, another outstanding result for 2011.

It was also pleasing to see three of the Club's senior players feature individually in 2011 - Michael McCann gaining State and All Australian selection, Cameron Hall winning D Grade's Association F & B and Michael Pepe being awarded the Association Best Player in the D Reserves competition.

I would like to thank all the coaches, support staff and trainers plus all the other volunteers for all their efforts throughout the year.

I hope you can again be a part of the North Fremantle Amateur Football Club next season and join us in the pursuit of greater achievements in 2012.

Phil Scott Colts (Chris Harris)

Coaching the Phil Scott colts also involves managing the North Fremantle Colts Programme as a whole. Season 2011 was a year the club put a priority on building up its youth player base, the committee wanted to see clear direction and development for the young players that chose North Fremantle as their football club of choice.

Expectation was for a programme to be developed and implemented that would assist North Fremantle Football Club in coming years to be successful and meet its "Mission Statement". This I believe was best achieved by allowing an atmosphere of inclusiveness, mateship and mutual respect to evolve and grow amongst all our colts.

The priority of increasing and building on our player base was achieved early in the year with for the first time the introduction of a third colts side. As the season progressed a set of 'Values' was drawn up around a "Mission Statement" for our colt programme. With the help of Baden Pratt and the 'Adopt A Colt' programme we had Adam McPhee (Fremantle Dockers) and our own Dillon Smith guide us to determine our 'Values' and take ownership of them. Our "Mission" and 'Values' are built around a core desire of 'Unity'.

Put simply as a member of the North Fremantle Colts Programme, regardless of what level a player is participating, that individual is important, valued and accordingly treated as such. To emphasise and demonstrate this training as a unit is considered a priority!

The respective West Coast Eagles and Brett Jones Colts coaches shall highlight their specific achievements for 2011. For the Phil Scott side it was a challenging yet successful year...an unusual statement I guess when it is remembered we did not play finals. However when it is realized we had very few second year colts from the 2010 season to build our 2011 side around it starts to make sense.

The boys we did have had to carry most of the load when it came down to demonstrating a physical presence at the contest and let me say they were terrific, what they lacked in numbers was made up for in courage. Their determination to meet the challenge was matched with the character of our many first year colts that needed to quickly develop to meet the steep learning curve they were presented with to succeed at A grade level.

The result for the year was we went out '(first round) in three (3) wins and 'came back in' (second round) with five (5) wins - giving us eight (8) for the year including beating four of the top five sides. This was matched with a percentage of over 100 % illustrating how narrow some of our losses were. Thus as their coach I am extremely proud of their efforts.

Next year looms as possibly a very exciting year for both the Phil Scott boys and the whole group for that matter PROVIDED we are all prepared to do the work required to build on what has already been a successful start to new our colts programme.

Brett Jones Colts (James Matkovich)

In what was a very successful year for the club as a whole, on and off field, the Brett Jones Colts were no exception, finishing as minor premiers and then going on to take out the flag in a very competitive finals series.

I took on the role expecting to be doing the ring around on Fridays to try and get a full team each week as the season wore on and unavailability became a problem. It quickly became apparent that this was not the case. That job fell to Damian Clancey as the recruiting work of Chris Harris provided the club with unprecedented three colts sides.

I have said before and will continue to say that these two men put the Brett Jones Colts in the position to achieve the success that they did. Chris' recruitment efforts were unlike anything the club has seen and the true results of his commitment to his position will not be seen until 2012, when I hope we will have three colts sides playing finals football.

The job Damian did has kept players at the club, a number of whom I believe will go on to be successful senior footballers for North Fremantle. I can not speak more highly of the role these two men played in securing this premiership for the club and thank them for every bit of assistance they gave me throughout the year.

The season started in uninspiring fashion with a close win over Trinity-Aquinas and a messy draw against University. As the team settled however, it became clear that this team was an extremely talented group of individuals with a strong desire to win. We went through the first round of games undefeated with a number of strong performances including a 116 point drubbing of North Beach.

The next time we played TA's mid season, a week after a tough fought win over second-placed Collegians, we put in a sub-par effort that resulted in us being embarrassed and proved to the boys that we were not invincible. This was the turning point of the season where we decided as a group that we would settle for nothing short of a premiership come September.

From that point we went from strength to strength, not coming close to dropping another game, subsequently finishing on top of the ladder.

The boys were aware that in the scheme of things, this meant nothing unless we took out the ultimate prize. With a week off to refresh, we once again met TA's in the semi for a place in the grand final. We had a heartbreaking final minute loss after starting

very poorly and it is my honest belief that the pain of this loss was a pivotal factor in getting us over the line on the last Saturday of the football year.

We disposed of Collegians in the preliminary final to set up the decider between the two rightful teams in TA's and ourselves. Given that our side from round 1 was almost completely different to the grand final side, the boys were reminded that realistically, we had not beaten them, and there was plenty to prove about themselves as footballers and as people. The result was a nail biting four point win, delivering the club its first premiership for 2011.

Congratulations go to Michael Thomas for being the best on ground in the grand final, Ben Golding for being runner up in the association best and fairest, Dechlan Clark and my former team mate James Rees as first and second runner-up in our best and fairest respectively, and finally Peter Celenza for taking out our best and fairest thanks to best on ground performances in the losses and grand final win against TA's.

Special congratulations go to Matt Zito, who with five or so rounds to go looked as if his time in the Brett Jones team was over, battling niggling injuries and form in the WCE colts. The way he carried himself at training led to his selection in the first final and he became a huge contributor over the series, reaffirming his status as a leader in the group and saying huge things about Matt as a person.

My thanks go to the following people:

Trainers – your efforts at training and on game day are excellent and your influence on the on-field performances of our players are underrated.

The committee – particularly those of you who directly helped out the BJ colts wherever possible, and Kevin Murphy for allowing me the opportunity to coach this group.

Tully Misich, Neville Hayward and their teams – for all the assistance on game day you provided and handling any clashes with coaching and playing that came up.

Chris Harris and Damian Clancey – for the aforementioned reasons, among many others. Captains Coen Rodgers and Joshua Cicanese – your efforts over the year and passion to win were huge factors in our win. You developed a huge amount as leaders over the year and will be of huge benefits to the BJ colts again in 2012.

Players – you made it happen and rose to any challenge that was presented to you

Buck Rodgers – Your planning and knowledge was invaluable and I thank you for everything you did for me and the team.

Max Winkless – for doing anything and everything required of you and more. Every role that we needed filled you did and did excellently. The team wouldn't have functioned and the premiership wouldn't have happened without your efforts and the motivation you gave the team at times when it was needed was a pivotal factor in our success.

Initially I planned not to coach in 2012 but as I require a shoulder operation won't be playing, it provides me with a chance to take this team back to back with Coen and Josh. I won't be accepting anything less with the colts squad only getting stronger and the club and supporters can look forward to much more success in the colts next year in all three grades.

D Reserves (Neville Haywood)

Starting the year with a huge training list and a keen approach to training meant that we were in for a reasonable season. With 60 or more players to choose from at the beginning we had a strong start and the season to follow was a great effort from the team only dropping 2 games both being to University.

With University being our only challenge it was up to the boys to regroup for the Grand Final after the defeat in the Semi and that they did playing a high standard for 4th grade and winning the Premiership.

Many thanks must go to Tully who was the backbone of the lower grades, with his finger on the pulse as to what was going on in and around the 4 sides, Kim Matthews and Jim Vost who helped out in the coaching Department, Adam Matthews and Beau Judge as Team Managers, Adam and Ben Matthews and Daniel Hunt as Runners, the trainers and our many supporters throughout the season. Also many thanks must go to the committee for providing a most enjoyable environment for all that participated in the 4's premiership.

Putting aside the above [which we did early in the season] I would like to congratulate the players for their dedication and perseverance. Week after week they were up for the challenge on game day. On several occasions in the first half of a game we not only matched but, headed top teams [CBC, North Beach & University] however, often with no interchange bench could not sustain the effort.

E Grade (Todd Wedgwood)

The E Grade started the season on a very hot day away to a younger, fitter side and it reflected on the scoreboard. Two 15 goal defeats in the first 3 rounds against 2 of the eventual top 3 sides put us at the lower end of the ladder early on.

As the year progressed the team bonded having some good wins and climbing into the 5 where we stayed for most of the season. The highlight of the year was the courageous come from behind win against Stirling. Away from home, with 18 fit players, the Maggies trailed all day. Some inspiring never say die efforts by several players kept us in the hunt. The game culminated with Trent Barrett taking a chest mark on the siren while the side still trailed. He calmly slotted a goal from beyond 50 to steal an unlikely but memorable victory.

As winter set in and some long distance away games were fixtured, numbers became thin and the load was left to too few. We dropped a crucial game against the bottom side having only 18 players at the start and finishing with less than a full side.

Coming into the last round the team needed to win and have another game go our way, unfortunately both results fell against us leaving the team in 6th place one game out of the five. The season was enjoyable and we were largely competitive. The fifth grade team is crucial for the continued strength and success of the NFAFC Magpies and should continue in numbers and strength in 2012

FOOTBALL OPERATIONS (Cameron Branch)

In season 2011 North Fremantle Amateur (NFAFC), registered 8 teams in the Western Australian League (WAAFL). These 8 teams consisted of 5 senior teams. A league, A reserves, D1 league, D1 reserves and E1 league and 3 colts teams. A colts (Phil Scott), 2nd colts (Brett Jones) and our 3rd colts team (West Coast Eagles).

Teams Performance

Starting with our A grade for season 2011 we did not meet our expectations. After finishing 2nd in 2009 and a disappointing 8th in 2010 we aimed to reach the finals in 2011. I believe mass injuries played a big part in A grade not reaching this goal and hence we finished in 6th place just one game out of the finals. We are bitterly disappointed as a club in the result but next year again we will set our standards high and will be aiming for at least a very achievable finals berth.

A reserves had a great season finishing third on the ladder and playing off in a grand final only to come up short by 15 points. I believe a great performance from a young side against experienced opposition. With a mass amount of injuries in our A grade side A reserves showed great depth this year in helping to feed our top side on a regular basis.

D1 and D1 reserves both finished on top of the ladder in 2011 season. D1 reserves only lost one game for the home and away season and went on to win the premiership with a comfortable win over University. D1 league were premiers and champions, a fantastic result to go through the season without losing a game. And to be challenged to the end in the grand final by arch rival CBC to get up by 5 points.

E1 had an up and down season with win/loss ratio but in the end were unlucky to miss out on the finals by one game to finish in sixth position. On some occasions throughout the year (mainly away games) our E1's struggled to get a full side and on one disappointing occasion we had to forfeit. Narrowly missing the finals is a good result considering lack of numbers and commitment at times.

Through the agency of Kevin Murphy (Development Officer) and newly appointed A colts coach Chris Harris we had a staggering 90 colts registered for the season. This result is reflective of the hard work and effort put in by Kevin and Chris starting from the end of 2010 season. With the club focusing closely on recruitment and strengthening our colts stocks for the future it seems we are on the right track. Our A colts had a slow start to the year but came on strong to the end. With a young team on

hand they showed a lot of talent and depth. The future looks bright with most players able to play on next season.

The Brett Jones Colts were premiers in 2011 after finishing on top of the ladder having only lost one game for the year. An outstanding performance, which proves depth and talent to bolster our colts and hopefully senior sides for years to come.

The West Coast Eagles Colts were a late nomination into the league this year due to an influx of players being registered just a couple of weeks prior to the season. With a rush to find a coach and support staff we were able to pull off a thirds colts team for the season. Unfortunately the side was heavily under manned at times we never once forfeited and our players battled hard week in week out. They did the club proud and managed a couple of wins to finish eighth.

Overall three premierships, one runners up and two teams just one game out of the finals.

Training Staff

This year we had a total of nine trainers on hand to help prepare players for training and games each week. With up to eight teams playing each week it was sometimes difficult to manage the spread of trainers to each team efficiently, but due to our head trainer (Nicola) and staff this was managed perfectly. A pool of nine trainers on hand was necessary to help share the load at times with our sides playing up to five different locations on a Saturday. Well done to the core group of 5 trainers who were there every week to strap, massage, stitch up, and help with rehabilitation to players with injuries to get them fit to play every Saturday.

Representative Football

The NFAFC was well represented at State level in 2011, with Michael McCann being selected to play in the Australian carnival in South Australia.

Association Fairest and Best

Congratulations are extended to D Grade player Cameron Hall and Michael Pepe who were awarded the League's Best and Fairest in 2011.

FINANCIAL REPORT

In 2011 we structured the fees along particular milestones for the season, and included incentives such as discounts and club shirts and this proved very successful in getting our best paid up membership in several years.

Again in 2011 we had the same problem befall Joel Harris who organised the football tipping competition. It was again well patronised and well run, but there are still some tippers who did not pay their entry fee.

We were inundated with a raft of new sponsors for 2011 and invoices duly dispatched saw sponsorship monies reach \$13k - somewhat short of our \$30k budget.

It has been a great year for the club on-the-field. The promotion of our club towards the end of last season to bolster our colts team was a huge success, so much so that two colts teams became three during the season.

Along with five senior teams, the club fielded eight teams this year - a first for the club. Then to have 4 of those teams play in a grand final was a terrific achievement. That three of those teams won their grand final was the cream on the cake. But there was a downside, financially we suffered as a result of our success.

The costs associated with putting an extra team into the competition (umpires fees, jumpers, support staff, grounds etc) while themselves not insurmountable, when added to other unbudgeted/unforeseen expenses, saw us close to an \$8K loss for the season.

First there was the regular light tower maintenance (budgeted for) and then a problem with one tower that doubled the regular maintenance.

Then we had that mishap on Ladies Night of a visit by Racing and Gaming that resulted in the club with a \$2K fine. One other problem was sponsorship, while we had many pledges before the season kicked off, not all came up with their pledges.

So the final upshot less revenue + greater expenses = a loss.

This is my last season as Treasurer, I will be returning to a team manager role with the Phil Scott Colts team. Todd Wedgwood is your newly elected Treasurer, so I hope you all give him all the help and support you have given me over the years

I would like to thank all the team managers this year for the jobs they have done and passing the match day fees on diligently. We reached our budgeted match day fee amount.

Thank also to our hard working Bar Manager, Ben French. Well done to training staff. They have provided a very professional service to all teams all throughout the year at training and at games. It is also the diligence shown by all with respect to the ordering/use of tape that has seen us keep our costs down this year.

- Create a best practice guide for the current and future Committees.

The Quality Club Environment Program consists of appropriate recognition and incentive awards for clubs as they achieve the three levels in the program.

When a club achieves the required criteria, it will be awarded a specific level; Bronze, Silver or Gold

In 2011 North Fremantle maintained the requirements of Silver accreditation and is looking to achieve Gold status in 2012.

SOCIAL REPORT (Clint Wiltshire)

This season proved to be challenging in many ways, hugely successful in others but one as a management committee, on in which we can safely say we learned a lot in regards to promotion, organisation and the induction of younger members of our football club.

The committee prepared the social calendar 4 weeks before the season started, taking into consideration venues, support of our sponsors and again providing some variety in terms of what was being offered in season 2011. The newly revamped website and

also our managed group on Facebook would be the vehicles for promotion and enlisting as much support in the way of helpers for each event would be crucial in determining the outcomes.

The first event for the year would be Ladies Day. After much consultation it was felt that Ladies Day traditionally only catered for 'A' league & Reserves as all other teams played away. In order to encourage attendance from ladies of all grades the committee decided to run a Ladies Night. The club enlisted the help of Samantha Thake, wife of a current player/member as it is important to have a female influence in the organisation and development of the evening. Sam did a wonderful job in lead up, typing and mailing many letters to local community organisations and businesses seeking donations for the evening to auction and present as prizes. The response was fantastic with many companies donating vouchers, services and products. The donations formed many prize/gift bags and formed the basis for the function; providing our ladies with some wonderful opportunities by being an active member of the football club. The event was promoted through Facebook, which unfortunately caused us some issues, especially with the younger members of the club. The lessons we learned were invaluable and revolved mainly around educating our young members about proper use of Facebook and appropriate behaviour at club functions. The visit from Racing and Gaming on the evening of the event, apart from being costly was seen as a great opportunity to tighten up in many areas. The Ladies night from an attendance point of view was extremely well supported and hopefully all the positives that can be taken from the evening will be used to continue to build the event into a marquee function for the club.

Throughout the year the club had organised some smaller functions like the Sponsors Lunch and provided many opportunities for past players and members to reconnect with the club. Thursday nights after training saw a number of players stick around and support the club over the bar. A change in proceedings, how the sides were announced, saw that number increase with player teas often a highlight.

Our sponsor's function was held at the Swan Hotel Basement and was attended by approximately 100 people. The evening encouraged involvement of players from all grades to assist with the running and even the music production for the night. Comments after the event were that every one who attended enjoyed the night and the vibe that was created was unifying.

Late August presented us with a great opportunity to rectify and right some wrongs that eventuated with the aforementioned Ladies Night. We decided to run an 80's night, encouraging a wide mix of players, partners and members in relation to age to attend. We offered plenty of food, wrist-banded any person that was underage and closely monitored the consumption of alcohol. With the addition of two security guards to also monitor the evening's proceedings resulted in a night where management did not have to contend with any issues. An almost perfectly run event and will model best practice for future events at the club.

Lastly we finished the year strong with a very well run Wind-up and Presentation night thanks to a massive effort from James Matkovich, Wes French and Damian Clancey. Held at the Town Hall in Fremantle we catered for 150 people and introduced an online ticketing system, which worked much better than expected. It

meant less fuss with organising tickets and carrying cash. The club would expect that in 2012 the playing group would better attend the event, as a number of trophies presented were not collected. The club will also seek to address sponsorship issues at their next meeting, encouraging hopefully more of them to attend this prestigious function.

The committee has already put in place some measures, which will again see improvement in the social scene for 2012. They include the booking of the Town Hall Fremantle, 2012, the enlisting of a female whose role would be more prevalent, new ideas and improvement in organisation and most importantly the addition of James Matkovich into the role of Assistant Social Secretary.
